Vitae

Bradley Nelson is active as a composer, conductor, and teacher. He has held positions as a professor and church musician in New York, Indiana, and California. His teaching posts have included Butler University, Point Loma Nazarene University, Indiana Central University, and Grossmont College. While pursuing graduate studies, he held teaching fellowships at the Eastman School of Music and the University of Rochester.

Currently residing in San Diego, he most recently led a large church music program in San Diego, presenting concerts with choir and orchestra at his church and at Copley Symphony Hall. His music has been performed in Westminster Abbey, St. Peter's Basilica, the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C., Chicago Symphony Hall, and San Diego's Copley Symphony Hall. In 1990, his choir presented concerts throughout Eastern Europe shortly after the collapse of the Berlin Wall and the disintegration of Communism. In addition to composing and guest conducting, he teaches composition. He is a skilled engraver and maintains a website for his online publishing company.
